Grandma was a kind lady of high standards. She was born in Wethersfield

Essex in 1903 moving to Ipswich after she married Herman. I particularly

remember them living at 27 St. Aubyns Road in Ipswich where there was a

wonderful cherry tree in the rear garden and an Anderson shelter built

during WWII. We used to play card games with her, particularly rummy and

patience. Her sister 'Paddy' lived with her until she died and was profoundly

deaf following a bout of meningitis.

She had an adventure of a lifetime in 1951/2 travelling to the United States

to visit daughter Jean who had married a GI at the end of WWII and

emigrated in 1946.

After Herman died she moved in with Auntie Valerie in Colchester Road

Ipswich then into 16 Melville Road in Ipswich and kept a very neat and tidy

garden. Alan and I went there on the day I married Susan and she cooked

us a steak and kidney pudding, ensuring we were well prepared for the







Chapter 2 Flora Bowtle 1903 - 1982



Flora Bowtle ^{1,2} 1903 – 1982

Flora was a grand lady who kept a wonderful garden and when we were children loved playing card games, such as rummy and patience. In November 1951 she sailed the Atlantic to visit her daughter Jean who had emigrated, travelling back in May 1952 on the Queen Elizabeth. In the 1960s she looked after her sister Gertrude (who we knew as Paddy) who had become deaf after contracting Meningitis.³


Flora was born on Sunday 15th November 1903 in Wethersfield, Essex^{1,4,5,6,11} and baptised on 26th December 1903 at St. Mary Magdalene, Wethersfield, Essex; daughter of Basil

She appeared on the census of 2nd April 1911 in Wethersfield, Essex; daughter aged 7 single, scholar living in eight rooms with parents and six siblings, born Wethersfield, Essex.¹



Flora married Herman Robert Wilkinson, son of Edward Henry Wilkinson and Cassandra Elizabeth formerly Palmer, on 5th April 1926 at St. Peter, Sible Hedingham, Essex, Herman an estate agent aged 28 of 1 Salisbury Road, Ipswich, Suffolk, Flora aged 22 of Sible Hedingham, both single, by banns, groom's father Edward Henry Wilkinson master mariner, bride's father Basil Bowtle deceased, witnesses Ronald Basil Wilkinson and Gertrude Edith Bowtle.^{7,8,9}

They had three children, Jean Mary Wilkinson 1927-2011; **Harold Eric Wilkinson 1930-2010**; and Valerie May Wilkinson 1936-2003.

Flora and Herman lived at 495 Woodbridge Road, Ipswich, Suffolk, around 1930¹⁰ then moving to 27 St. Aubyns Road, Ipswich, Suffolk, before 1939 remaining there until Herman died in 1963.³



Flora appeared on the pre-WWII mini census of 29th September 1939 at 27 St. Aubyns Road, Ipswich, Suffolk; married born 15th November 1903 housewife living with her husband, three children and possibly someone else. 11 Note these records are currently closed so this is assumed. We do not know what the red star means.

She had a journey of a lifetime when she visited her daughter Jean in the USA, sailing on Tuesday 6th November 1951 from Southampton on the SS Homeland arriving in New York on 15th November 1951 and staying at 236 Patterson Street Harrison New Jersey. ¹² See Appendix I.





On Wednesday 7th May 1952 she sailed from New York on the RMS Queen Elizabeth tourist class¹³ arriving in Southampton on 12th May 1952.¹⁴ See Appendices II and III.

Flora was widowed on 4th January 1964 when her husband Herman rose from bed during the night to visit the toilet but collapsed and died aged 66 of heart attack.⁵

She then moved to Colchester Road, Ipswich later in 1964 living with daughter Valerie and family.³ About 1966 she purchased 16 Melville Road, Ipswich, Suffolk⁵ remaining there until she died.

Flora died on Monday 24th May 1982 in Ipswich Hospital, Heath Road

Wing, Heath Road, Ipswich, Suffolk, aged 78 of bronchopneumonia, left hemiplegia and cerebal metastasis (lung cancer which had spread to the brain).^{5,16} See Appendix V.



She was buried next to her husband Herman on Thursday 27th May 1982 in Ipswich Cemetery, Belvedere Road, Ipswich, Suffolk.¹⁵

Her will was proved on 8th July 1982 in Ipswich, Suffolk, of 16 Melville Road Ipswich, effects not exceeding £25,000 (~£86,000 in 2015). 16 See Appendix IV.



His father died in 1889 and he took over the family business and was listed in Kelly's 1890 Essex Directory as a baker and corn dealer in Wethersfield, Essex.¹³



Smith, Great Bardfield, £232 2s. 9d.; H. Weston, Halstead, 24.

Mr. Orfenr appeared for the debtor.

In reply to the Receiver, the debtor said: In March last I executed, in favour of Messrs. Cramphorn, Ltd., the following three securities:-(1) Mortgage on my freehold property at Wethersfield, subject to prior charges; (2) a bill of sale to secure payment of £265 10s. 3d., given over my household furniture, trade effects, &c.; and (3) an assignment of certain book debts.






Appendix II - 1923 auction of the bakery, house and milling premises

Helen Caroline Oakley 1,2,3 **1866 - 1949**

Helen, also known as Ellen,^{3,4,5} was born on Sunday 9th December 1866 in Kiev, Ukraine.^{4,5,6,7,8,9,10} She was baptised on 7th May 1867 in the Evangelical Church of St. Luther, Kiev, Ukraine; daughter of Richard Fairlam Oakley (mechanic) and Elizabeth nee Fletcher.² See Appendix I for her baptism certificate and a translation completed in 1893. Note that her mother is given as Elizabeth Fletcher but no such person can be found. We believe Fletcher was an Anglicisation of Fleischhauer and an Elizabeth Fleischhauer was born to German/Dutch parents in a German non-conformist enclave near Odessa at the right time. Flora Bowtle said her grandmother spoke with a strong accent and learnt little English although she was born ten years after Elizabeth died.

Her first census appearance was on 2nd April 1871 in Wethersfield, Essex; daughter aged 4 as Ellen C Oakley, scholar living with her parents, four siblings and a servant born Kieff Russia.^{5,11}

They only had one child, **Basil Bowtle 1857-1921** after twenty years of marriage.



Richard Fairlam Oakley ^{1,2} 1838 - 1912

Richard was a mechanical engineer for Richard Garrett in Leiston and worked for some time in the Ukraine. He then had his own agricultural machinery business, particularly steam threshing, in Wethersfield Essex.^{3,4,5,6,7,8}

He was born on Saturday 7th April 1838 in Water End, Sandridge, Hertfordshire, as Richard, father Thomas Oakley (farmer) and Ann Oakley formerly Butterfield. 1,9,5,7,6,2,8,10,11 Richard was baptised on 29th April 1839 at St. Leonard, Sandridge, Hertfordshire; son of Thomas Oakley and Anne. 2,12

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His first census appearance was on 6th June 1841 in Water End, Sandridge, Hertfordshire; aged 3, living with his parents and four siblings, born Hertfordshire.¹³

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He was sent to a private school where he appeared on the census of 30th March 1851 in High Street, South Weald, Essex; a boarder aged 13, scholar living with his brother James at James Monkhouse's school, born Water End Hertfordshire.⁹

Richard is absent from the census of 7th April 1861, we assume he must have been in the Ukraine by this time. He returned in 1867 having married and had four children.

He married Elizabeth Fletcher, believed to be the daughter of Martin Fleischhauer and Elisabth Knoop, on Monday 17th August 1863 in Odessa, Kherson, Richard aged 25, Elizabeth aged 20, both single. We know that Elizabeth was born in the Ukraine and had a strong foreign accent, thus it is assumed that Fletcher was an Anglicised name. The closest fit found was Elizabeth Fleischhauer who came from a German nonconformist enclave near Odessa. They had fifteen children, Jane Sarah Oakley 1862-1928; Richard Thomas Oakley 1863-before 1867; Edward Charles Oakley 1865-1913; Helen Caroline Oakley 166-1949; James Oakley 1868-?; Emma Oakley 1870-1942; Willie Henry Oakley 1871-1951; Frederick Richard Oakley 1873-1909; Albert Charles Oakley 1875-1952; Constance Charlotte Oakley 1876-1905; Frank Herbert Oakley 1879-1942; May Oakley 1881-1960; Flora May Oakley 1882-1933; Thomas Percy Oakley 1884-1957; and Richard Francis Oakley 1888-1956.

On 28th July 1868 at the County Court, Braintree, Essex, Richard recovered £3 19s (~£180 in 2005) from William Patten.¹⁵

DESTRUCTIVE FIRE.

A FAMILY IN DANGER.

Early on Wednesday morning the house of Mr. G. F. Oakley, agricultural engineer, close to Wethersfield churchyard, was found to be on fire. Miss Oakley, who had been ill in bed for several days, was the first to give the alarm, having been aroused by the smell of burning. Many willing helpers set to work to clear the furniture out, some of it being saved, but the kitchen and most of the contents, including knives and forks, were destroyed.

John Passield, Thomas Passield and Jack Rust, Wethersfield youths, pleaded guilty to stealing among them 31 wainuts, value 3d., belonging to Richard T. Oakley, at Wethersfield, on November 4, and Henry Ridgewell, who was summoned with them, pleaded not guilty.—P.c. Webster said he saw all four defendants in the prosecutor's meadow, throwing sticks at the walnut trees. They ran off when they saw him. He afterwards took eleven walnuts from Thos. Passield, three from John Passield, and 17 from Rust.—The prosecutor said he used to have bushels of walnuts off the trees where now he had only pecks. He had cautioned the pilferers, but it was of no use.—The Chairman administered a good lecture to the defendants, who were all bound over under the First Offenders Act.

On 20th November 1907 in the County Court, Braintree, Essex, Richard prosecuted four youths who were bound over for stealing walnuts from a Richard T Oakley (assumed to be Richard F Oakley).²⁹

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

Oakley's House Fire

THE RECENT garage fire at' Oakleys' triggered memory of a fire at the same location about 100 years ago. This picture shows the Green at that time – notice the size of the trees! In the right background is Oakleys, a house destroyed by the fire in early 1900s. This was the home of an agricultural engineer Fairlam Oakley

This extract is taken from memoirs of a local man written in the 1950's.

"Threshing Tackles" This business was owned by a Mr R.F.Oakley and had its workshop and yard on the comer of Braintree Road adjoining Winton House and it was from there that the tackles journeyed to the farmsteads around the district to thresh out the com. Portable engines were used at first, and this meant of course that all the tackle had to be horse drawn. What a terrible job. This type of engine was ousted with the advent of the steam engine, and so the horses' life became a little better. The large timber and tiled residence that belonged to these trade premises as they were in 1877, was burned down somewhere around 1908





There were several dramatic fires, (though what fire is not dramatic). There was the night the windmill was burned to the ground, and the night "Mr. Oakley's House" caught fire. There was, in a way, a certain amount of satisfaction in the last one as people generally cannot help being rather pleased when their prophecies come true. Mr. Oakley, with a grand philanthropic gesture, had made a Public Reading Room for the village in his own home. This was about sixty-five years ago, and it is to be hoped his gesture was appreciated. Unfortunately he carpeted the floor of the Reading Room with coconut matting. "You'll have a fire there one day if you are not careful," said somebody's uncle. The whole village apparently endorsed his opinion. And sure enough these words came true. Nobody was pleased of course, (perish the thought), but for all that! There was no Fire Brigade sixty years ago, and people used to just make chains with buckets and do the best they could. There was a man from Bardfield with a horse and cart who used to be called upon to assist, but the best he could offer was barrels and buckets.


Appendix II – Location of Richard's "Threshing Tackles" business

Elizabeth Fleischhauer ¹ 1842 - 1893

Harold Eric Wilkinson stated that "My mother (Flora Wilkinson nee Bowtle) used to say that Elizabeth always spoke with a very strong French accent and never really learned much English (Note that this was a handed down story as Flora was born ten years after Elizabeth died)".³ Thus, we know she was foreign. Richard Fairlam Oakley married an Elizabeth Fletcher in Odessa², but nothing can be found about her. An Elizabeth Fleischhauer has been found with coincidental place and date of birth. It is recognised that this connection would be based upon an unproven assumption, but we are fairly confident as Fletcher could be an Anglicisation of Fleischhauer. Many villages were established in the Odesssa area c1820-24 by German non-conformists.^{3,4}

Elizabeth was born on 5th or 8th September 1842 in Grunau, Russia^{1,2,3,5,6,7,8,9} and baptised on 27th September 1842 in Grunau; daughter of Martin Fleischhauer and Elisabeth Knoop.¹

Elizabeth married Richard Fairlam Oakley, son of Thomas Oakley and Anne formerly Butterfield, on 17th August 1863 in Odessa, Kherson, Richard aged 25, Elizabeth aged 20, both single.² They had fifteen children, Jane Sarah Oakley 1862-1928; Richard Thomas Oakley 1863-before 1867; Edward Charles Oakley 1865-1913; **Helen Caroline Oakley 166-1949**; James Oakley 1868-?; Emma Oakley 1870-1942; Willie Henry Oakley 1871-1951; Frederick Richard Oakley 1873-1909; Albert Charles Oakley 1875-1952; Constance Charlotte Oakley 1876-1905; Frank Herbert Oakley 1879-1942; May Oakley 1881-1960; Flora May Oakley 1882-1933; Thomas Percy Oakley 1884-1957; and Richard Francis Oakley 1888-1956.

We know she and her children came to England in 1867 from a passport issued in St. Petersburg. ¹⁴ See Appendix I.

Elizabeth's first appearance in English records was on the census of 2nd April 1871 in Village, Wethersfield, Essex; wife aged 28 married, living with her husband, five children and a servant, born Mislovitz? Russia.^{5,10}


