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
Volume 7 Introduction Florence May Butcher (1905 -1986)

Florence, affectionately known as Flo, was one of five children and spent her entire life in Ipswich Suffolk. She was married to Frederick Arthur Ransome who died in 1954 aged 53 following pioneering heart surgery. They had five children but sadly Audrey died of breast cancer in 1968 aged just 40. After Fred died she lived in Kestrel Road, Ipswich with her youngest son Robert (Bob) until she died.

Her ancestors were hard working and law abiding people as very few references to them could be found in newspapers. They originated from Ipswich, rural Suffolk, Essex, Cambridgeshire, Norfolk and London (Middlesex).


Florence, Fred and their family lived for many years at 83 Cavendish Street, which has since been demolished. This street was influential in all our lives and being the reason their son John (Jack) met and married Molly Overett who were the parents of my wife Susan Patricia Ransome.

1952 Ordnance Survey map of Cavendish Street




Descendants of Florence May Butcher




Chapter 1 Florence May Butcher 1905-1986



Florence May Butcher 1,2,3 1905 - 1986

Florence, also known as Florence Ransome and affectionately as Flossie or Flo, was born on Monday 16th January 1905 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England, daughter of John Starling Butcher (1875-1951) and Eleanor Durrell formally Norman (1872-1936).^{1,2,3,4,5}

She first appeared in the census taken on Sunday 2nd April 1911 at 39 Albert Street, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 6, as a daughter living in four rooms with her parents and four siblings and being born Ipswich Suffolk.⁴



Florence married Frederick Arthur Ransome, son of William Pym Ransome and Pleasance formally Hines, in the 1st quarter of 1924 in Ipswich.^{1,6,7} They had five children; **John William Frederick Ransome (1924-1994)**; Audrey May Ransome (1928-1968); Peter Charles Ransome (1931-2008); Robert Thomas Ransome (1934-2014); and Barbara E Ransome (1942-).

She appeared in the pre-WWII mini census taken on Friday 29th September 1939 at 83 Cavendish Street, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, married being born on 16th January 1905 doing unpaid domestic duties and living with her husband and three children (note 2 records are closed, probably Peter and Robert, John was with his grandfather).⁵




Sadly, her husband Frederick died on Tuesday 23rd March 1954 at Hill End Hospital, St. Albans, Hertfordshire, England aged 53 of a blood clot following experimental heart bypass surgery at Guys Hospital, London.^{1,7,9,10}

She lived at 79 Kestrel Road, Chantry, Ipswich, Suffolk, England with her youngest son Robert (Bob) from the late 1950s until she died in her daughter Barbara's house at 2 Westwood Road Ipswich on Monday 4th August 1986, aged 81 of Kestrel Road, wife of the late Fred.^{3,11,12} Florence was cremated on Friday 8th August 1986 at Ipswich Crematorium North Chapel, Belvedere Road, Ipswich, Suffolk, England.¹⁰



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Key places in Ipswich for Florence




Kestrel Road Albert Street Cavendish Street

Chapter 2 John Starling Butcher 1875 – 1951 (father)



John Starling Butcher^{1,2,3} 1875 - 1951

John, a baker then a dock labourer^{5,6,7,8} who was also recorded as John Sturling Butcher, was born on Monday 19th April 1875 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England, son of John William Butcher and Ann Dersley.^{1,2,4,5,6,7,8}

He first appeared in the census taken on Sunday 3rd April 1881 at 11 Albion Place, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 5, a scholar living with his parents and four siblings and born in Ipswich Suffolk.⁴

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He then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 5th April 1891 at 22 Albion Place, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 16, an unmarried baker living in four rooms with his parents and four siblings and born in Ipswich Suffolk.⁵

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
John then married **Eleanor Durrell Norman**, daughter of George William Norman and Elizabeth Jane formerly Lorking, in the 4th quarter of 1900 in Ipswich.^{1,3} They had four children; Charles John Butcher (1901-1974); **Florence May Butcher (1905-1986)**; Alice Rose Butcher (1906-1979) and Ellen Maud Butcher (1909-1990). John also 'adopted' Eleanor's illegitimate daughter Jenny Ellen Norman raising her as his own child. Also, it is recalled that Florence said she was one of six, which means one further child who presumably died young is missing. However no trace can be found, so this is assumed to be false.

John's next appearance was in the census taken on Sunday 31st March 1901 at 6 Regent Court, Regent Street, St. Helen, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 26, head of the

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household being a married dock labourer living in two rooms with his wife and step-daughter and born in Ipswich Suffolk.⁶

He then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 2nd April 1911 at 39 Albert Street, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 35, head of the household being a married dock labourer for a corn merchant and living in four rooms with his wife, four children and a step daughter, and born in Ipswich Suffolk.⁷



John's wife Eleanor died on Wednesday 2nd December 1936 at the family home of 41 Cavendish Street, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 63 after much suffering patiently borne.^{11,12}

John then appeared in the pre-WWII mini census taken on Friday 29th September 1939 at 41 Cavendish Street, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, a widower born on 19th April 1875 being a dock labourer (heavy worker) living with his widowed daughter Ellen Collison, a grandson John (Jack) Ransome and two others (probably Ellen's daughters) whose records are closed.⁸

John died on 16th August 1951 at 41 Cavendish Street aged 76 husband of the late Ellen.^{9,10} He was buried on 21st August 1951 at Holy Trinity, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, at 3:15pm.¹⁰



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Key Places in Ipswich for John




Chapter 3 Eleanor Durrell Norman 1872 – 1936 (mother)




Eleanor Durrell 'Nell' Norman 1,2,3 1872 - 1936

Eleanor, who was also known as Nell, Eleanor Butcher, Eleanor D Hammond, Ellen Durrell Norman and Ellen Butcher, was born on Tuesday 24th September 1872 in Priory Street, St. Botolph, Colchester, Essex, England, daughter of George Norman (sewing machine maker) and Elizabeth Jane Norman formerly Turner. 3,4,5,6,7,8

She first appeared in the census taken on Sunday 3rd April 1881 at Trafalgar Buildings, Shire Hall Yard, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, an unmarried daughter as Eleanor D Hammond being a scholar living with her parents, five siblings and a grandmother and born in Colchester Essex.⁵



She then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 5th April 1891 at 58 Lower Orwell Street, St. Mary at the Quay, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 18, an unmarried daughter being a stay maker living with her parents, three siblings, grand-mother, uncle and a visitor and born in Ipswich, Suffolk.⁶




On Sunday 29th April 1894 Eleanor gave birth to a daughter, Jenny Ellen Norman. No father being given on her birth certificate or baptism entry. 11,12,13,14,15


Eleanor then married **John Starling Butcher**, son of John William Butcher and Ann formerly Dersley, in the final quarter of 1900 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.^{1,2} John 'adopted' Jenny, raising her as his own child. Eleanor and John then had four children;

Charles John Butcher (1901-c.1974); **Florence May Butcher (1905-c.1986);** Alice Rose Butcher (1906-1979); and Ellen Maud Butcher (1909-1990). As Florence said she was one of six, one child is unaccounted for, presumably dying young. However no trace can be found, so this assumed to be false.

Eleanor then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 31st March 1901 at 6 Regent Court, Regent Street, St. Helen, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 28, a wife being married and living in two rooms with her husband and daughter and born in Colchester Essex.⁷



Her next appearance was in the census taken on Sunday 2nd April 1911 at 39 Albert Street, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, a wife being married and living in four rooms with her husband and five children and born in Colchester Essex. She had been married for 10 years with 5 children all alive.⁸ Note this suggests that Florence was one of six may be wrong or the child was born and died after 1911.





Eleanor died in the last quarter of 1936 in Ipswich, Suffolk aged 63.9

John William Butcher 1,2,3,4

1850 - 1901

John, a general / quay (dock) labourer,^{8,9,10,11} was born in the 4th quarter of 1850 in lpswich, Suffolk, England, son of Starling Butcher and Eliza formerly Mann.^{1,2,5,6,7,8,9,10}

He first appeared in the census taken on Sunday 30th March 1851 in Albion Street, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 6 months, a son living with his parents and a sibling and born In Ipswich Suffolk.⁵

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John was baptised on Tuesday 21st September 1852 at Holy Trinity, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, son of Starling Butcher (labourer) and Eliza of Albion Street Ipswich.⁴ He was then received into the church on Sunday 22nd February 1857 at St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, aged about 3 years, son of Starling Butcher (labourer) and Eliza of Ipswich.⁴

His next appearance was in the census taken on Sunday 7th April 1861 at 30 Siloam Place, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 10, an unmarried son living with his parents and a sibling and born in Ipswich Suffolk.⁶

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John then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 2nd April 1871 in Hamlete Court, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 18, an unmarried son working as a labourer whilst living with his parents and being born in Ipswich Suffolk.⁷

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He married **Ann Dersley**, daughter of George Dersley and Ann formerly Lucas, in the 2nd quarter of 1874 in Ipswich.^{1,3} They had seven children; **John Starling Butcher** (1875-1951); Alice B Butcher (1876-1958); George William Butcher (1877-1939); Starling Butcher (1878-1957); Henry Butcher (1880-1956); Maud Ann Butcher (1881-1884); and Florence May Butcher (1883-1922).

John next appeared in the census taken on Sunday 3rd April 1881 at 11 Albion Place, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 31, head of the household being a married general labourer living with his wife and five children and being born in Ipswich Suffolk.⁸

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He then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 5th April 1891 at 22 Albion Place, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 41, head of the household being a married, quay labourer living in four rooms with his wife and five children and being born in Ipswich Suffolk.⁹

John was then in the census taken on Sunday 31st March 1901 at 29 Long Street, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 51, head of the household being a married general labourer living with his wife, two children and a grandson Frederick Simco, and born in Ipswich.¹⁰

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

Ann Dersley 1,2,3,4,5 1850 – 1915

Ann, a silk winder who was also known as Ann Butcher, Ann Darsley and Ann Deisley, was born in the 4th quarter of 1850 in Thetford, Norfolk, England, daughter of George Dersley and Ann formerly Lucas. 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9

She first appeared in the census taken on Sunday 30th March 1851 in Magdalen Street, St. Cuthbert, Thetford, Norfolk, England aged 4 months, a daughter living with her parents and five siblings and born in Thetford Norfolk.³

Ann's family moved around a lot, presumably do to her father's work. In 1854 they were living in Coldfair Green, Knodishall, Suffolk and in 1858 in Peasenhall, Suffolk from the birthplaces of her siblings in the 1861 census.⁴

Ann then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 7th April 1861 in St. Johns Street, St. James, Bury St. Edmunds, Suffolk, England aged 10, a daughter attending school and living with her parents and nine siblings and born in Thetford Norfolk.⁴

Her third appearance was in the census taken on Sunday 2nd April 1871 in Duke Street, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 19, an unmarried niece working as a silk winder living with James Wiles, his wife (her sister), two brothers and a nephew and born in Thetford.⁵

Ann then married **John William Butcher**, son of Starling Butcher and Eliza formerly Mann, in the 2nd quarter of 1874 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.^{1,10} They had seven children; **John Starling Butcher** (1875-1951); Alice B Butcher (1876-1958); George William Butcher (1877-1939); Starling Butcher (1878-1957); Henry Butcher (1880-1956); Maud Ann Butcher (1881-1884); and Florence May Butcher (1883-1922).

Ann then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 3rd April 1881 at 11 Albion Place, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 30, a married wife living with her husband and five children and born in Thetford Suffolk.⁶



She had had seven children, six of which were still living.⁹



Key places in Ipswich for Ann Dersley



George William Norman ^{1,2,3} 1837 – 1896

George, a coach smith's boy, white smith, sewing machine maker, fitter & turner, blacksmith then a coachsmith^{6,7,8,9,10,11,13,16} was registered as George Norman Evans and was also known as George W Hammond, his step father's surname. He was born on Monday 30th October 1837 in St. Martin, Colchester, Essex, England, illegitimate son of William Evans (gardener) and Mary Ann Norman of Angel Lane Colchester.^{1,4,5,6,7,8,9,10} A bastardy record could not be found at the Chelmsford Record Office on Friday 19th August 2016.¹⁵

His first appearance was in the census taken on Sunday 6th June 1841 in Abbey Street, Thorpe-le-Soken, Essex, England aged 3, living with his mother, stepfather, a sibling, Charles Hammond (b 1831), and another being born in Essex.⁵

George then married Elizabeth Jane Lorking, daughter of John Durrell Lorking and Elizabeth formerly Turner, in the 4th quarter of 1865 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England. They had nine children; George John Norman (1865-1911); Charles Frederick Norman (1867-1891); Elizabeth Jane Norman (1869-1949); **Eleanor Durrell Norman (1872-1936)**; George William Norman (1875-1876); George William Norman (1877-1963); Gertrude Eliza Norman (1879-1934); Mary Ann Norman (1881-1960); and Lillie Alice Norman (1884-1885). They also adopted Victoria Kate Fiske (1886-1967).

His next appearance was in the census taken on Sunday 2nd April 1871 in Priory Street, St. Botolph, Colchester, Essex, England aged 31, married head of the household as George Hammond (step father's surname) employed as a sewing machine maker living with his wife, three children and a lodger and born in Colchester Essex.⁸

Key places in Ipswich for Elizabeth




1904 map showing East Street back to backs on the Civic College site



Starling Butcher^{1,2} c1825 – 1890

Starling, a quay labourer, brickmaker then a labourer for a bricklayer^{1,3,4,5,6,8,9,10} was also known as Harley Butcher, Sterling Butcher and Stirling Butcher. He was born about 1825 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England^{2,3,4,5,6} and baptised on Sunday 15th January 1826 at St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, son of Starling Butcher (seaman) and Frances of Albion Street.^{1,2}

Key places in Ipswich for George Dersley




1884 Map showing Long Lane which became Long Street and the back to backs that were demolished becoming the location of Ipswich Civic College.



The Rope Walk and Rope Lane were once cut off from the river by meadows until Long Lane was cut through. The remnant of this today is the southern stub of Long Street between the College and the University running from the bottom of Back Hamlet into car parks. This lane was eventually to form one of the worst slums in the town. The decline of pottery, tile and brick-making as well as rope-making seems to have triggered a burst of trading in plots of land, rapid building of 'cottages' with small pubs on the corners, grocery shops etc. All of this was driven by the profit-motive, not by philanthropy. Very little or no attention was paid to decent infrastructure: paving, drainage, access etc. Because it catered to the housing demands of the lower and lowest strata of Ipswich society, the result was the building of slums with appalling sanitation, overcrowding, disease and exploitation of the inhabitants. The distance between the frontages of the cottages varied from less than fifteen feet in David Street, even less in Baker Street and nine feet in Short Lane. The last of these was 200 feet long and in 1881 there were eighteen households with 102 people living there. On Wednesday 20th October 1847 at the Essex Crown Court he was sentenced to two months in Colchester House of Correction for stealing a quantity of oats from William Firmin of Copford.8

William Evans, 67, gardener, was indicted for entering a barn for the purpose of stealing a quantity of oats, the property of William Firmin, of Copford. - Mr. MAUDE, for the prosecution. -William Smith, inspector of police, deposed that on the night of the 23rd of September on passing the barn of the prosecutor's he observed a light; a waggon passed by soon after, and the light was put out; he then sent one of the men who came up with the waggon for the prosecutor, and on his arrival they entered and found the prisoner in the barn; some oats were strewed about the bay of the barn as though they had been spilt in the removal from one sack to another.-The prosecutor's son deposed that the cats on the previous night had all been left in the sacks, and that the prisoner had no business there.-The prisoner handed in written statements, but failed to account satisfactorily for being in the barn. Sentenced to two calendar months' imprisonment in -Guilty. Colchester House of Correction.

William next appeared in the census taken on Sunday 30th March 1851 in Fordham, Essex, England aged 70, widowed head of the household working as a gardener living with a daughter and born in Aldham Essex.⁴



He then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 7th April 1861 at Shols? Cottage, Fordham, Essex, England aged 80, widowed head of the household working as a gardener living with his daughter and born in Aldham Essex.⁵



Mary Ann Norman^{1,2,3} 1817 – 1896

Mary, a wash / charwoman^{7,8} who was also known as Mary A Hammond, was born about 1817 in Colchester, Essex, England.^{4,5,6,7,8,9} She was baptised on Sunday 30th April

1826 at St. Giles, Colchester, Essex, England, daughter of William Norman (labourer) and Mary of St. Giles, baptised with three siblings.¹ This William Norman was thought to be her father as he is the only one in Colchester of right age and a labourer (surprisingly). It looks as if she was baptised with three brothers when she was 9 years old but the record does not say that.

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Mary had an illegitimate son **George William Norman (1837-1896)** by William Evans. 13

She then married **George Hammond**, son of John Hammond and an unknown mother, on Tuesday 10th March 1840 at St. Nicholas, Colchester, Essex, England, George a coach smith, both single, of full age and of this parish, married by banns, groom's father John Hammond white smith, bride's father William Norman labourer and witnessed by George Mann and Mary Norman.^{2,3,10}



George and Mary had nine children: Sarah Ann Hammond (1840-1915); William Hammond (1842-1929); Robert Hammond (1842-1842); Mary Ann Hammond (1846-

1916); Charles Hammond (1848-); Harriet Hammond (1851-); Ellen Hammond (1853-1887); Susannah Hammond (1855-1941); and Frederick Hammond (1858-).

John married Elizabeth Turner, daughter of Thomas Digby Turner and Jane formerly Turner, on Monday 22nd January 1844 at St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, John Lawking butcher aged 19, Elizabeth aged 21, both single of Short lane, groom's father James Lawking butcher, bride's father Thomas Turner turner, witnesses Thomas Turner and Mary Jane Turner.^{6,8} They had ten children; **Elizabeth Jane Lorking (1843-1918)**; Mary Jane Lorking (1845-1849); James Durrell Lorking (1847-1850); Sarah Durrell Lorking (1849-1927); Elizabeth Lorking (1851-1851); James Kensett Lorking (1852-1910); Susan Durrell Lorking (1854-?); John Durrell Lorking (1855-1939); Kensett Durrell Lorking (1857-1896); and Alice Durrell Lorking (1858-1860).

which he identified as his property. Prisoner said that John Lorking, prosecutor's foreman, knew as much about it it as he did; but this the latter denied. Prisoner was then given into custody.

He was a witness on Monday 1st March 1858 at the Quarter Sessions, Shire Hall, Ipswich,

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Lorking was then called, and reiterated his denial of participating in the robbery.

Mr. Mills: Can you swear to that meat?

Lorking: No, sir.

Mr. Mills: Do you think it possible for butchers to swear to meat?

Lorking: I should think not unless they put a private mark on it.

Mr. Mills addressed the jury for the prisoner, and
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Suffolk, England in the case of Joseph Clark, a fellow butcher, who was accused of stealing 4lbs 4ozs of beef from his master. Joseph was sentenced to 3 months hard labour.⁹

John then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 7th April 1861 at 21 Curriers Lane, St. Nicholas, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 36, married head of the household working as a butcher living with his wife and six children and born in Ipswich Suffolk.⁴

Starling, a mariner,^{3,4,8,16,17} who was also known as Stirling Butcher and Sterling Butcher, was born about 1797 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.^{1,3,4,16,17} He was baptised on Sunday 28th May 1797 at St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, son of Thomas Butcher and Mary.¹



1883 1:500 map showing Albion Place and Myrtle Road










1882 1:2,500 Ordnance Survey map of Bentley



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

Hannah, a charwoman^{4,5,6} who was also known as Hannah Mann, Hannah Timperley, Hannah Temperly, Hannah Templey and Hannay Wells, was born on Thursday 25th November 1802 in Gosbeck, Suffolk, England.^{1,2,4,5,6} She was baptised on Sunday 16th January 1803 at St. Mary, Gosbeck, Suffolk, England, base born daughter of Mary Wells of Gosbeck as Hannay Wells.^{1,2}

Hannah married Isaac Mann, son of Isaac Mann and Elizabeth late Thornton,¹⁶ on Monday 27th May 1822 at St. Margaret, Ipswich, Suffolk, England, both single of this parish, married by banns and witnessed by Lydia Wells and Buckm Bugg Senr.^{3,7} They had three children; Mary Ann Mann (1822?-1853); Isaac Mann (1824?-1825); and **Eliza Mann (1825?-1871)**.

Sadly, Hannah's husband Isaac died in July 1827 aged just 30.^{12,13}



Hannah then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 6th June 1841 in Salthouse Lane, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 30, a charwoman living with her three

children and a John Button aged 67, born in Suffolk.⁴ She had two illegitimate children before this census and the father was most likely John Button; Harriet Mann (1836?-1892); and Henry Mann (1840-1842).

She witnessed the marriage of Starling Butcher and her daughter Eliza Mann on Sunday 18th October 1846 at the Ipswich Register Office, Ipswich, Suffolk, England.^{8,9}

Hannah then married John Timperley in the 1st quarter of 1847 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.¹⁰ They did not have any children.

Her next appearance was in the census taken on Sunday 30th March 1851 in Salthouse Lane aged 46, married wife as Hannah Temperly working as a char woman living with her husband and a step-son, born in Gosbeck Suffolk.⁵

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Hannah's second husband John Timperley died aged 66 in Ipswich in May 1857.¹⁷

She then appeared in the census taken on Sunday 7th April 1861 at 3 Salthouse Lane, St. Clement, Ipswich, Suffolk, England aged 60, widowed head of the household as Hannah Templey working as a charwoman and living with her daughter, born in Gosbeck Suffolk.⁶








1890s 1:10,560 Ordnance Survey Maps of Shudy and Castle Camps





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

1885 1:2,500 ordnance Survey map of West Wickham












1876 1:2,500 Ordnance Survey map of Bocking




